

Verse: They encircled me, compassed me about; in the Lord's name I crushed them.


Verse: I shall not die, I shall live and recount the deeds of the Lord.

Verse: The stone, which the builders rejected, has become the cornerstone. This is the


work of the Lord, a marvel in our eyes.


As the troparia are sung the deacon (or priest) returns to the altar.
